Pray God's Blessing - A Message from Msgr. Marren

When the Lord God was delivering His people from the slavery of Egypt, He instructed the people to mark the lintel (door frame) of their doors with the blood of a lamb as a mark of His providential protection. Of course, in some parts of our world, there is a modification of this practice using chalk or some other means of marking the lintel of the door. In marking of our door frames, we are asking God to bless and protect all those who live within our home and all those who visit. Should you wish to do this, simply mark the lintel inscribing 20 for the first part of the year, then a plus sign representing the cross of salvation and another plus sign separating the letters CMB (the initials of Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar, the names of the three Magi or three kings). Finally, add 22 for this year. The inscription CMB not only stands for the names of the Magi but also stands for Christus Mansionem Benedicat, which means "Christ bless this home". The inscription then for this year would be "20+C+M+B+22" (See picture below for reference). What a wonderful activity asking God's blessings on all our homes!
