## The Call for National Eucharistic Revival

**June 2022 - July 2025**

The Eucharist represents the presence of God which is the healing force of humanity. The need for healing has been a catalyst for U.S. bishops to pronounce Sunday, June 19th, the feast of Corpus Christi, as the launch date for a three-year National Eucharistic Revival.

Throughout the revival, all members of the Catholic Church in the U.S. are encouraged to deepen their understanding and devotion to Christ through the transformative power of the Holy Eucharist. Each consecutive year will involve deep study into the meaning of the Eucharist through catechesis, liturgical celebrations, Eucharistic Adoration, and prayer.

Each diocese around the country plans to host their own local Eucharistic Congress, including Atlanta on June 17th-18th, leading up to a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis.
