

#### Who We Are

**Catholic World Mission** was founded on May 28, 1998, by a Legionary priest, a member of the Regnum Christi movement. Our mission is to bridge the gap between donors and partners to uplift those in spiritual and material poverty.


- We **spread** the message of the Church and help to rebuild communities worldwide. We also strive for the long-term transformation of poverty to self-sufficiency.
- We **support** the work of priests, religious, missionaries, and lay people who strive to make a difference in the lives of others.
- We **bridge** the gap between the poor of the world and our generous donors, making a way for Jesus to be better known to those who live in poverty and to the benefactors who give so selflessly wherever the need is greatest.

#### Our Partnership Model

Our partners come to us for help because they **trust our process** and know we intend to lift up their projects. All of our work is done in partnership with each community in need. We take a Trinitarian approach to transforming communities, relying on the teamwork of our generous Catholic World Mission family of **supporters**, a trusted **partner**, and the **community** itself. We want to assure our benefactors that we are good stewards of their hard-earned dollars. We vet all potential partners to ensure integrity. And we require an endorsement from the local bishop to approve of each project. Through our formal funds-distribution process, our partners are obligated to provide materials illustrating how the use of funds transformed the community.

#### Where We Work

We serve in more than **30 countries** in Africa, Asia, Europe, North America, and Central and South America. We work in collaboration with our supporters to educate, evangelize, and transform impoverished communities through physical and spiritual healing.











#### **Bringing Communities to Christ**

- Enabling more than **2 million people** to hear the Gospel, train in the Catholic faith, and share it with others

- · Making possible a **self-sustaining, income-generating** cocoa farm in Ghana
- Providing emergency aid to Ukrainians fleeing violence









#### Paving the Path to a Brighter Future

Caring people like you support a variety of Education projects, including ...

- Providing more than **\$500,000** in **scholarships** to students and teachers in 10 countries
- · Helping over **23,000 students** attend school
- Repairing, building, and supplying needed materials to more than **50 schools** worldwide
- Ensuring **148 children** of tea farmers in Bangladesh can go to school
- **Equipping schools** in Nigeria and Uganda with new bathrooms



#### Mano Amiga Schools

Mano Amiga was founded in 1963 in Mexico to bring Catholic education to children from low-income families. Catholic World Mission supports **37 Mano Amiga campuses** in **seven countries** throughout **Latin America and the Philippines**. Run by Legionary priests, Mano Amiga schools offer rigorous academics, accompany children spiritually through Catholic formation, offer accessory programs to help students' families, provide basic health services, and more. Thanks to our supporters, more than **22,000** children who would never have had the chance to go to school have been educated at a Mano Amiga school.

#### Monstrances

Catholic World Mission emphasizes evangelistic revival and spiritual development in its core values. Since 2012, we've distributed **8-12 monstrances** every year to underprivileged parishes and communities in order to foster increased devotion to the life-giving power of the Eucharist.

#### Evangelizadores de Tiempo Completo (ETC)

ETCs are full-time Catholic lay missionaries supported by Catholic World Mission to address the shortage of priests in remote villages in South and Latin America. The ETC program is staffed with Regnum Christi members. ETCs have carried the Good News of the Gospel to 4,938 communities in Mexico alone. These evangelizers serve more than **50,000 people** through mission work, preparation for the sacraments, para-liturgical celebrations, catechism classes, and work at rehabilitation centers.

#### Seminarian Formation

Since 2018, Catholic World Mission has supported the needs of **hundreds of men** discerning the priesthood in different corners of the world. We focus on forming missionary priests — men who work as God's priestly shepherds in remote territories where people may never have heard of Jesus, or in places where poverty and hopelessness are extreme.

# Building Bridges ... Together



We take a Trinitarian approach to every project we support. Each project includes the people or community being served; our generous Catholic World Mission family of supporters; and a trusted partner, such as a bishop, priest, religious order, or lay person who helps oversee the project. Here are a few of our dedicated partners:

#### Felicia Amanambu

Felicia served as a missionary in Nigeria. When she saw the poverty there, she asked people what their greatest needs were and how she could fill them. Since 2015, we have partnered with Felicia to build a new roof for a primary school, renovate and transform a rundown church into a school, and construct new bathrooms to keep Holy Rosary Elementary School students safer and healthier.



#### Monsignor Simon Assamoah

Monsignor Simon has been an agent of positive change for the people of Enchi, Ghana, for the past 10 years. He is the pastor of the Immaculate Conception Parish and vicar general of the Diocese of Wiawso. With his help and the support of loving people like you, we have:

- **Constructed** a church and water wells for a poor village
- Provided support for the battle against COVID-19
- **Equipped** local schools with learning supplies, water, building improvements, and a covered cafeteria
- · Supported a **cocoa tree farm** to increase its production and become a stable means of income for the community
- · Pioneered our monstrance distribution program
- · Fostered an **increase** in vocations in his diocese




#### The Missionaries of the Poor

The brothers seek to aid the most impoverished communities and individuals — particularly children. They feed over 275 people in Kenya every day, educate 120 children in full-time school, and house and care for dozens of homeless people, including those with disabilities. Our supporters help the brothers **defray the costs** of food, water, textbooks, facilities, clothing, and medicine.

#### The Compassionate Franciscan Sisters of the Poor

The sisters work in the **Philippines**, **Jamaica**, **Kenya**, and **Haiti**. They build centers for the poor, homes for the homeless, and orphanages and residences for children with mental and physical challenges. They also care for the elderly and terminally ill, operate free mini-schools, and more.



#### The Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales:

The missionary priests have developed a practical, wide-reaching plan to help our brothers and sisters in Christ who are living in crushing poverty in Valdez Limones, Ecuador. In partnership with them and with our supporters, we have:

- · Launched the Child Empowerment Project to provide orphans and street children with a daily meal, uniforms and clothes, school supplies, access to counseling, school fees, and more
- Raised funds to supply three rooftop water tanks and purifiers for the community
- Renovated and repaired a **community center** where the MSFS priests hold programs, faith formation classes, job-training classes, and other events
- Purchased three **motorized boats** to bring the hope of the Gospel to people in remote communities reachable only by water

## Across the Bridge ... and Back

When Catholic World Mission builds a bridge, it's always a two-way street. People and communities benefit directly from the projects we facilitate. Here are some of the stories that illustrate our impact and inspire us for the work still to come:

#### Bonnya, Bangladesh

Bonnya is the youngest child in her family. Her mom and dad are both tea farmers. In the community where she lives, people have been working in the tea gardens for 170 years. Bonnya dreams of escaping the poverty of the tea plantations. When she grows up, she wants to serve her country by working as a police officer to make Bangladesh a better, safer place. Thanks to our generous supporters, Bonnya, 10, is receiving a Catholic education that will enable her to make her dreams come true!



#### Benwen Lopez, India

Benwen is a seminarian in the Diocese of Sindhudurg. He joined the seminary at age 39. "It was the intensity of God's presence in the Eucharist that drew me to the priesthood," he says. "For me, the Eucharist is everything." Catholic World Mission supporters helped provide Benwen with a scholarship to further his studies in Rome. There, he'll continue his journey to the priesthood as he grows academically and spiritually in preparation to serve generations of Catholics.



#### Egyam Children's Home, Ghana

The sisters who run the home ensure that **78 orphaned children** receive an education, learn about the Gospel, and form a family with one another. Soon, with the help of Catholic World Mission supporters, the sisters will be able to sell water packets to support their ministry. Construction is under way on the facility that will allow the sisters to commercially package safe, clean water. This will provide an urgently needed resource for the community and help the sisters generate sustainable income.
