# Education

## Offering the Helping Hand of Mano Amiga Schools

An enlightened mind opens the door to generational change. Through education, we lift the impoverished out of generational poverty, spreading seeds of hope and providing avenues away from the negativity of drugs and crime.

#### **Blessed and Humble**

Mano Amiga Santa Catarina has helped the Guadalupe-Hernandez family get by since Hurricane Alex tore apart their home three years ago. Since then, this family of 6 has been living in two small rented rooms. They make do with sleeping quarters in the living room, consisting of bunk beds and a couch, while they save for a new home.

This family considers itself very fortunate. Senor Hernandez has steady work as a laborer. The oldest child, Miriam, teaches religious education to younger children; Natalie lectors at church. "We can see the difference Mano Amiga is making in our children," says Senora Guadalupe.

"They are developing values that their peers in this area do not seem to have."

# Evangelization

## Alleviating spiritual poverty through Evangelization

Supporting worldwide missionary efforts to spread Gospel teachings and bring the love of Christ through corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

Evangelizadores de Tiempo Completo (ETCs) are fulltime missionaries in Latin America, supporting and augmenting the work of parish priests. With 6,000 Catholics to every priest in Mexico, ETC missionaries are desperately needed. Each of these men reach 5,000 people annually throughout rural Mexico.



Mission Corps is a team of recent graduates who have been called to spend a year of their young lives spreading the Word of God to their peers. Based in key cities throughout the U.S., the young adults work through parishes, service organizations and communities. Each ministers up to 4,000 young people, lifting them from the despair of worldly worries and virtual promises.

# Disaster Relief

### Removing constraints left in the wake of disaster

Partnering with missionaries in Kenya and Haiti, furthering programs designed to provide self sufficiency for victims of natural disasters and famine.

Nine Missionaries of the Poor brothers have been feeding 275 families daily since the famine outbreak several years ago. Thanks in part to Catholic World Mission donors, the brothers have successfully turned the corner from a famine disaster

relief program, to a community of families engaged in farming the land and educating the children.



# Hope and Help for the forgotten in Haiti

Tens of thousands of families have been stuck in time since the 2010 earthquake in Haiti- living in Tent Cities throughout Port Au Prince. With 90% unemployment and no access to school for the children, there is risk of generational poverty as the result of this horrific disaster.



Missionaries have been able to hire teachers from right within the Tent City, Acra and build furniture for the school house.

# Opening doors to disease prevention and wellness in third world areas

Supporting short-term medical mission trips, permanent clinic construction and shipping supplies to third-world medical facilities.


